

ECONOMICS FAQ Newsletter for SPRING 2022 Registration

ECON GENERAL QUESTIONS:

1. When do I register?

Check your UGA email for an email from the UGA Registrar's Office or view your registration date/time within the "Registration Detail" menu item under Registration in your [Athena](#) account. Registration time ticket emails should go out the week of October 25.

Be sure to clear all holds on your [Athena](#) account well in advance of your registration date. If you have not been advised yet, then you must use [SAGE](#) to access your primary advisor's calendar and find an appointment.

2. What holds do I have on my registration for SPRING 2022?

Log onto Athena and follow these [instructions](#) to see what holds you might have. NOTE: Students with an AlcoholEdu Hold who have completed Part 1 but need access to Part 2 can email ktruesdell@uhs.uga.edu or call 706-542-8690 for assistance.

3. What classes do I register for?

Check your advising form for that information.

4. What is an UDJGE?

Upper Division General Elective = 3000-level and up course. Check the [UGA Bulletin](#) for information about courses.

Not all classes are offered every semester. Not every class adheres to the semester listed in the UGA Bulletin, so be sure you look on Athena to see if the course is actually being offered. If it's not in Athena, it isn't being offered.

5. What is an ECON Elective?

ECON Elective = ECON 4100-level and up course, excluding 4800 and 5900.

6. When are ECON Electives offered?

Spring and Fall semesters only.

ECON 4010 Intermediate Microeconomics is the prerequisite course for all ECON electives. You must take and pass ECON 4010 prior to taking an ECON elective, except that we do allow ECON 4010 and 4750 Econometrics to be taken together if you receive advisor permission and the required registration override.

Our current plan of ECON electives for Spring 2022 is as follows:

- Spring 2022: 4150 Environmental, 4160 Urban, 4200 Economic Growth & Development, 4250 Education, 4300 Public Sector, 4450 Law, 4550 International Trade, 4700 History, 4750 Econometrics, 4760/6760 Time Series Econometrics*

*Requires both ECON 4010 and ECON 4750 as prerequisites for the course. You will be asked to drop the class if you haven't completed the prereqs.

ECON 4760/6760 seats are restricted for Spring 2022. Students were instructed to complete the permission of department survey in order to request access to the course. Deadline to complete the survey was Monday, October 25 at 5 pm.

7. What ECON courses are available for majors to take in Summer 2022?

- ECON 4010 Intermediate Microeconomics is available in the Summer 2022 semester. It is offered in the Maymester. This is a 15-day period of time, so students should regard class participation and study as a huge priority.
- ECON 4020 Intermediate Macroeconomics is available in the Summer 2022 semester. It is offered in the Maymester Session. This is a 15-day period of time, so students should regard class participation and study as a huge priority.

8. What online ECON courses are available for majors to take in Summer 2022?

None. Please note that while ECON 4040E The International Business Environment is offered in Summer 2022, this course does NOT count as an ECON Elective and it is restricted to ONLY International Business co-majors for Summer 2022.

9. What is the minimum grade requirement for ECON courses for an ECON major?

The minimum grade is a C in all ECON courses for ECON majors. Grades below a C would require either a retake of the course or replacing it with another course, if applicable.

For the Areas of Emphasis, a minimum grade of B- is required in each course for the emphasis.

10. Is ECON 5900 Senior Thesis available in the Summer semester?

No, Senior Thesis is only available in Spring and Fall semesters.

11. Are ECON majors required to have an internship for college course credit?

No, an internship for college course credit is not required for ECON majors. If a student has an economics-related internship and wants to register for ECON 4800 Internship for Credit (3 hours), then the student must have the prerequisite of at least ECON 4010 Intermediate Microeconomics before being permitted to take ECON 4800. Use the ECON 4800 proposal form found [here](#) when you meet with an ECON faculty member about your upcoming internship. Then send the form via email to your primary academic advisor for final approval and course access. Deadline for Summer 20201 internships will be the last day of classes for Spring 2022 semester. Remember, ECON 4800 does NOT count as an ECON Elective.

12. Is special permission needed to take ECON 4020 Intermediate Macroeconomics and ECON 4760/6760 Time Series Econometrics in Spring 2022?

YES! These seats will be in high demand for Spring 2022. Students were asked to complete the survey by 5 pm on Monday, October 25 if they hope/plan to register for any of these classes in Spring 2022. Permission of department is required in order to register for these courses in Spring 2022. Students will be contacted via email with instructions for registering in the Spring if permission was granted. Remember, seating is limited in these classes so permissions were given to students graduating soon.

13. What Upper Division Terry Electives are available in Spring and Summer 2022 to “non-majors” to register for?

If a course is NOT on the list, then it is NOT available for other majors to take the class. Always check the prerequisites for a course using the [UGA Bulletin](#). If you don't have the prerequisite for the course, you will not be allowed to take the course.

Be sure to note that the DATE on which some courses will open to “non-majors” is Wednesday, December 1 at noon.

14. When do STAT electives open for all students for Spring 2022 classes?

STAT electives open on JANUARY 4, 2022. Check the list of prerequisites for STAT courses using the [UGA Bulletin](#).

15. Will some classes be 100% online in Spring 2022? How will I tell how my Spring class will be taught?

Pay close attention in Athena for CAMPUS code and [INSTRUCTIONAL METHOD codes/descriptions](#). Most classes in Terry College will be In-Person instruction for Spring 2022.

16. Which Senior Thesis class do I register for?

Register for ECON 5900 Senior Thesis. Do not attempt to register for ECON 5900S or ECON 5900H.

The research group section of ECON 5900, taught by “multiple instructors” in the past, will not be offered in Spring 2022.

ECON 5900H is for honors students only, and they must have completed 3 hours credit in CURO research course(s) in order to be eligible for ECON 5900H (3-hour credit course). Check with your advisor for the ECON 5900H Senior Thesis CURO application if interested, but in the meantime you should register for a “regular” section of ECON 5900 as soon as possible. We will swap the seat out for an ECON 5900H seat if you are approved for the ECON 5900H course.

AB ECON GENERAL QUESTIONS:

17. What business-related courses are available to AB ECON students? Remember to research course descriptions and syllabi via the [UGA Bulletin](#).

- ACCT 1160 Survey of Accounting: no prerequisites.
- CSCI 1100 Topics in Computing: **Do not take this course!** Take MIST 2090 instead.
- ENTR 5500 Introduction to Entrepreneurship: email rallen13@uga.edu for waiver of the ACCT 2101 prereq on or before Dec 1 and include your UGA ID# (it opens at noon that day to all students).
- FINA 3001 Financial Management: Prerequisites of ACCT 2101 or ACCT 1160. Email finance@uga.edu if you have not also taken MIST 2090, because you will need a prerequisite waiver in order to register for FINA 3001! Include your UGA ID#.
- LEGL 2700 Legal and Regulatory Environment of Business: only open to AB ECON students pursuing the Certificate in Legal Studies by requesting permission from Deede Walker at dwalker@uga.edu . Include your UGA ID#.
- MARK 3001 Principles of Marketing: open to AB ECON majors. No prerequisites.
- MBUS 3000 Business Fundamentals as Applied to the Music Industry: Prerequisite of ACCT 1160 or ACCT 2101.
- MGMT 3001 Principles of Management: Prerequisites of ACCT 2101 or ACCT 1160. Email asexton@uga.edu if you have not also taken MIST 2090, because you will need a prerequisite waiver in order to register for MGMT 3001! Include your UGA ID#.
- REAL 4000 Real Estate: no prerequisites.
- RMIN 4000 Risk Management: no prerequisites.

18. Where do I find the College-wide Liberal Arts Requirements list of courses?

19. What are the prerequisites for ECON 4950 Competitive Strategy? NOTE: ECON 4950 is part of the Area of Emphasis in Consulting.

The prerequisites are (ACCT 1160 or ACCT 2101) **AND** (FINA 3000 or FINA 3001).

NOTE: You must have taken ACCT 1160 or ACCT 2101 in order to be able to register for FINA 3001 or FINA 3000.

BBA ECON GENERAL QUESTIONS:

20. How do I register for the Business Core Classes?

FINA 3000, MARK 3000 and MGMT 3000 are the business core classes. They are co-requisites of each other. You must register for all three simultaneously on Athena. You can only register for courses taught in Athens. Instructions for registering are provided on the following pages.

NOTE: Students must have overrides and permission of the advisor to register for part of the business core to be taken in Summer 2022; these overrides were given during your advising appointment.

You must register for all three of these Terry courses concurrently in Athena to add them to your schedule for next semester. When registering for these courses:

- a. Type the desired course CRN numbers into three of the fields in your worksheet.
- b. All three CRN numbers must be entered into these fields at the same time.
- c. Once the CRN numbers have been added, click on the "Add to Summary" button, then click the "Submit" button and all three courses should be added to your schedule.

21. Why was I told to take BUSN 4000 with the business core classes?

If you did not have college credit for MATH 2200 or MATH 2250, then you were advised to take BUSN 4000 along with the business core classes. BUSN 4000 is the prerequisite course you must have in order to take ECON 4010 and ECON 4020 later. **This course is very important to take right away.** BUSN 4000 is a key course for the first semester you're in Terry College if you have not taken MATH 2200 or MATH 2250!

22. Which MGMT 5560 classes are reserved for IB Co-Majors?

IB-Co majors can only register for CRNs 56410 and 20827 of the MGMT 5560 sections.
